Shalford in the County of Fairfield - I Gato Treadwell of Huntington in Said County before the Honte Samuel Him Johnson Judge of the Country Court for daid Country do under oath declare that I am now and have been a resident citizen of the United Hate, America, and am a free negro man - that I was born & brought up in said County & am now fifty five years old - that in the . 1780 I enlisted for three years as a private foldier in the company commanded by Capitain Wright, I think his name was Joseph Allen Wright in the Regiment com manded by Gol: Heman dwift of Cornwall in said State, in the Connecticul Line and whom the continental establishment in the late revolutionary army - and that In the fall of the year 1780 West-point and ferved faithfully impaid Re-1780 until the elofe of the said Revolutionery war in 1783 and was in actual Jenice Buring that whole period - that the latter part of the period afores? Capt Peter Robinson commanded faid company - and that at the close of sewar I was discharged at New Hindson not many mile, from West point and received a regular discharge in writing - which was, about two years afterwards, deflioyed with the house in which I dwell by fire. that I am extremely poor and by reason of my reduced circumstances in life I am in great need of apristance from my country for support Dated at Stratford afores this 232 thay of March Gato my Treadwell A.1818. -
